Snapshot of our children - birth to age 5

- 1,156 Children 0–3
- 30% of children under the age of 5 live below the poverty level
- 60% qualify for free and reduced lunch
- 10% of births are to teen moms
- 40% of Newborns are born to single mothers
- Nearly 1 in 5 newborns are Hispanic
- 26% of children 0-3 are Hispanic
- 71% of parents are in the workplace
- Highest rate of infant death in the region

Early Brain Development is critical

- Brain Framework built in first 3 years is foundation for all future learning
- Building brains is like building a house – "Architecture" matters
- Stress weakens brain architecture
- ACES studies



While 85% of a child's core brain structure is formed by age three, less than 4% of public investments on education and development have occurred by that time.

Economic Impact of investing in Early Learning


"Although education and the acquisition of skills is a lifelong process, starting early in life is crucial. Recent research – some sponsored by the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis in collaboration with the University of Minnesota – has documented the high returns that early childhood programs can pay in terms of subsequent educational attainment and in lower rates of social problems, such as teenage pregnancy and welfare dependency."



The achievement gap

- Nearly one in four children enter kindergarten without basic school readiness skills
- For every 50 children who don't learn to read in kindergarten, 44 of them will still have trouble in 3rd grade
- Children without reading skills by 3rd grade are far less likely to graduate
- Grades & absenteeism rates by 3rd grade predict with 90% accuracy whether the child will drop out

Early Learning Programs in No Pacific County

- ECEAP 5 sites, 118 slots
- Head Start services recently ended
- Early Support for Infants & Toddlers – 49 children served
- Licensed Child Care need for 425 slots, only 1 licensed center in North Pacific County
- Subsidized care for just 6 infants and 25 toddlers
- Women Infants and Children (WIC) nutrition program

- ► Family Fairs in May 2010 and 2011 involving more than 220 children in early learning fun and connecting parents with community resources that support their success.
- Health and Wellness Fairs in August 2010 and 2011 providing over 250 children and parents with developmental screening, school supplies, haircuts and community resource information
- Welcome Baby program for moms of newborns a collaborative effort led by the Pacific County Health Dept.
- Culturally-responsive education event for parents, public school teachers and early learning professionals to ensure all children thrive.
- 3 year Strategic Plan to guide the coalition's future work.
- \$50,000 from the Foundation for Early Learning to launch and maintain our community coalition.
